1 INTRODUCTION

The German Survey on Volunteering (FWS) is the basic instrument for social accounting on volunteering in Germany. The volunteering rate and the volunteering potential are drawn from the detailed survey of voluntary activities and the willingness to volunteer. These rates can be reported among population groups and across regions. The survey includes person aged 14 and older living in Germany.

Up to now, data of the Survey on Volunteering has been collected in 1999, 2004 and 2009. During these three waves the survey agency TNS Infratest Sozialforschung was responsible for data collection and reporting. The first wave was conducted within a project group on honorary office (Projektverbund Ehrenamt, later Projektverbund Freiwilligensurvey). It consisted of TNS Infratest Sozialforschung in Munich, the Institute for Sociological Analyses and Consultancy (ISAB) in Cologne, the German Research Institute for Public Administration at the German University of Administrative Sciences Speyer and the Institute for Development Planning and Structural Research at the Universität Hannover. The Institute for Social Work and Social Education (ISS) coordinated the survey from June 2003 to December 2010. Since December 2011 the scientific management and supervision lies with the German Centre of Gerontology (DZA). The survey is funded by the Federal Ministry of Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth (BMFSFJ).

In this discussion paper the survey topics (chapter 2) of the second wave of the German Survey on Volunteering 2004 (FWS 2004), information on the sample (chapter 3) and on the survey methods (chapter 4) are given. Further, contact information for data users (chapter 5) and the survey instrument (chapter 6 and appendix) are presented.

2 SURVEY TOPICS

In the Survey on Volunteering 2004 information (1) on volunteering, (2) on the person and (3) on the context of volunteering were collected.

Information on volunteering includes questions on volunteering in general as well as on voluntary activities in 14 societal areas, which is the basis for the calculation of the volunteering rate (Engagementquote). The importance of the voluntary activity, the characteristics of the first activity (B1) and, if applicable, a second activity (B2) is surveyed. Where a respondent carries out several activities, the most time-consuming activity is chosen as the first activity. It was recorded how many activities a person carries out (up to 28 activities were recorded, two per societal area), however information on a third, fourth or further activity was not collected. The volunteering potential (Engagementpotenzial) is deducted from a person's interest in extending the current volunteering (volunteers at the time of the interview) or taking up a voluntary activity (non-volunteers at the time of the interview). There is further information on earlier volunteering and other voluntary activities in a wider sense.

Additionally, information on the person comprises socio-demographic information, such as age and gender, and socio-economic characteristics, such as employment status and education. Further, information on the migration background, on values, on the religion and on time expenditure was also collected.

Regarding the context of volunteering, organisational and regional information was surveyed, for example, characteristics of the organisational framework of the voluntary activity and areas of improvement of the conditions of volunteering.

Table 1 shows the main topics and survey contents in the instrument of the Survey on Volunteering 2004 and the respective question numbers.

3 SAMPLE

The sample of the Survey on Volunteering 2004 is a representative landline sample of the resident population aged 14 and older. The telephone interviews in 2004 were carried out in German, thus the survey is representative for the German-speaking population of Germany. The sample has been stratified disproportionally according to the population of the 16 federal states (Länder) to achieve sufficient sample sizes for specific analyses of the states. The sampling frame for the sample in 2004 was generated using a random-digit-dialling-method according to ADM standard.




Figure 1: Composition of the sample of the Survey of Volunteering 2004

The sample includes n=15,000 completed interviews. The samples of the new federal states, Berlin, Hamburg and Rhineland-Palatinate were stocked up to at least 900 cases. The states Bavaria, Baden-Württemberg, North Rhine-Westphalia, Lower Saxony and Hesse are part of the sample without additional cases. Thus, they are not represented according to their proportion of the population without weighting. Additionally, the samples of Bremen, Saarland and Schleswig-Holstein were not expanded. The composition of the sample is shown in Figure 1. It was funded by the Federal Ministry of Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth (BMFSFJ).




Figure 2: Unweighted and weighted cases according to federal states

To calculate the volunteering indicators on the national level, data has to be weighted retrospectively to achieve a proportional relation of the federal states (the weighting factors provided by TNS Infratest Sozialforschung balance data according to federal state, size of municipality, gender and age groups). As the sample is composed disproportionally due the different populations of the states, cases of the highly populated states are included in the analyses with relatively high weightings and cases of less populous states with comparatively low weightings (Figure 2).

4 INTERVIEW METHOD

Data of the Survey on Volunteering has been collected in three waves with telephone interviews by TNS Infratest Sozialforschung on behalf of the Federal Ministry of Family Affairs, Senior Citizens, Women and Youth (BMFSFJ) in 1999, 2004 and 2009.

Interviews for the second wave in 2004 were carried out from 22 April to 15 July 2004 (BMFSFJ, 2005, p. 411). The methodological report of the second wave has been published in the main report on the Survey on Volunteering (BMFSFJ, 2005). It can also be downloaded from the website of the Research Date Centre of the DZA (FDZ-DZA): www.fdz-dza.de.

5 USE OF DATA

Anonymised micro data of the survey from 1999, 2004 and 2009 are available for secondary analyses. Scholars working at a university or a research institution as well as students aiming at an academic graduation (as Bachelor, Master, and PhD) can receive the data free of charge from the Research Date Centre of the DZA (FDZ-DZA). Data can only be used for scientific research.

6 SURVEY INSTRUMENT


